

- Nomadic hunter (little information flow)
- Agrarian
- Industrial
- Knowledge worker (excessive information (Microsoft, digital world, e-mails, etc.)
- Conceptual
  - Where the future belongs to those who make connections, can think with the Right-Brain Directed (creative) side.

### Is your agency in the Information Age or the Conceptual Age?


Are you a mix of right and left brain thinking or mainly one over the other?


### **Learning Organizations**







### **Agency and Community Assets**
