



### Map of Traditional and Reservation lands










### Tribal Affairs Program

- 2) promote internal education and advocacy of tribal perspectives,
- 3) build relationships and partnerships with tribes and their communities.



### **Consultation Framework**



- Government-to-Government

- Tribal consultation has been developed and re-affirmed over multiple administrations
- Direct agencies and bureaus to consult with tribes
  - Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act (NAGPRA)
  - National Historical Preservation Act, Section 106 (NHPA)
  - National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA)
  - American Indian Religious Freedom Act (AIRFA)

### **Objectives**



- 1) Provide an immersed outdoor experience to tribal youth within the Traditional Cultural Property (TCP) known as Grand Canyon
- 2) Connect and Reconnect tribal youth with their ancestral lands and cultural resources
- 3) Serve as a platform to tribal youth to learn from tribal elders and park employees
- 4) Educate tribal youth about the National Park Service's mission, land management practices, and public lands and serve as a potential recruitment tool for tribal youth interested in federal service at a public land management agency.
